GUANGDONG-HONG KONG-MACAO GREATER BAY AREA TOURISM RESEARCH ALLIANCE

On November 21, 2018, the Macao Institute for Tourism Studies (IFTM), the Hong Kong Polytechnic University (HKPolyU), and Sun Yat-Sen University jointly signed a memorandum to establish the Greater Bay Area (GBA) Tourism Research Alliance to carry out research on tourism cooperation and relations, monitor the sustainable development of tourism, and jointly study issues regarding the development of tourism in the GBA, providing research support to GBA governments and assist policy-makers with intellectual support.

On 13 December 2019, the Macao Institute for Tourism Studies (IFTM) was officially approved by the Ministry of Culture and Tourism as the relying unit of the Macao SAR and listed as the Tourism Education and Training Base for the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area, undertaking the task of tourism training and talent cultivation, and providing a professional platform of tourism talent training for authorities, enterprises and public institutions in tourism.



FORUM HOST

DR. YANG JING JING MACAO INSTITUTE FOR TOURISM STUDIES AND ASSOCIATE EDITOR (CHINA), TOURISM MANAGEMENT (IF: 10.967)

Dr. Yang has international teaching experience, in UK, China, and New Zealand. She has worked not only in academics, but also in government, tourism industry, tourism planning and consultancy. Working with multiple stakeholders in multiple fields in multiple countries equip her with multiple approaches to understand tourism and research tourism. Her achievement in tourism is evidenced by honors and professional distinctions, publications of books and articles on high impact international journals, delivering international and national conference keynote speeches and seminars, and participating in advisory and review bodies.



KEYNOTE SPEAKER

PROFESSOR DAI BIN PRESIDENT, CHINA TOURISM ACADEMY

Dr. Dai Bin is President of China Tourism Academy and Director of National Tourism Data Center of Ministry of Culture and Tourism of the People's Republic of China. Concurrently, he is Chairman of Editorial Board of Tourism Management, doctoral supervisor of Dongbei University of Finance and Economics and Henan University, and adjunct professor of Toyo University in Japan, subsidized by State Council. Specialized in the studies of tourism enterprise management and tourism industrial economics, he has published 450 theses and over 50 monographs, textbooks and research reports, as well as presided over 60 research projects, 1,000 lectures and academic reports.



PROF. BOB MCKERCHER THE UNIVERSITY OF QUEENSLAND

Dr. Bob McKercher is a Professor of Tourism at the University of Queensland. Prior to that he worked in the School of Hotel and Tourism Management at The Hong Kong Polytechnic University afor 22 years. He has been a tourism academic since 1990, beginning his career at Charles Sturt University in Albury, NSW, Australia. He spent 10 years in the Canadian tourism industry in a variety of advocacy and operational roles. He is is the Chairman of the Board of the International Academy for the Study of Tourism. He has been awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award by the International Academy of Culture, Tourism and Hospitality Research and has also been honoured by being named a Fellow of the International Academy for the Study of Tourism.

DR. LAM CHING-CHI (CINDIA) MACAO INSTITUTE FOR TOURISM STUDIES

Dr. Lam is Academic Coordinator of the Bachelor Degree Programmes (Chinese Medium) at IFTM. She graduated from University of Southern Queensland (Australia) with a Bachelor of Science, completed her master degree at Heriot-Watt University (England) and her Ph.D. from the Catholic University of Portugal (Portugal). Her research span from the psychological aspects of employees, tourism service quality, the sustainability of tourism industry and the development of tourism products (including medical and wine tourism). She has published books, articles in top international journals and worked on many government and commercial consultancy and research projects.



DR. VIRGINIA LAU MENG CHAN MACAO INSTITUTE FOR TOURISM STUDIES

Dr. Lau is an Assistant Professor at IFTM. She is teaching various subjects, including accounting, financial management and brand management. She also has industrial experience working with various brands in the OEM process involving design, contracting, manufacturing and quality control. She participated in various consultancy projects in Macao, including retail industry satisfaction, tourist profiling and local tourism development. Her research interests include tourism and hospitality management, branding, CSR and tourism education.



PROFESSOR JIE LI SUN YAT-SEN UNIVERSITY

Dr. Jie Li is Associate Professor at the School of Tourism Management, Sun Yat-Sen University. Before joining SYSU in 2019, She obtained her Ph.D degree in the University of Hong Kong and did her post-doctoral research at King's College London. She has published in top tier tourism journals. She has also won multiple government projects as principal investigator or convestigator. Her research interests include sustainable tourism development, tourist behavior and destination marketing.



DR. JINAH PARK HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC UNIVERSITY

Dr. Park is a Research Assistant Professor in the School of Hotel and Tourism Management. Her research focuses on destination marketing, tourist mobility, and cross-border tourism. She works for the Hospitality and Tourism Research Centre of the School and has been participating in the tripartite collaboration of the Greater Bay Area Tourism Research Alliance since 2019. Through several studies on destination branding and regional path creation in the Greater Bay Area, she attempts to connect the dots between tourism research and cross-border integration practices.



DR. PENNY WAN YIM KING MACAO INSTITUTE FOR TOURISM STUDIES

Dr. Wan has taught a range of tourism, hospitality, gaming and urban planning subjects and supervised student dissertation at the tertiary level. She is a tourism consultant with diverse project experience (i.e. theme parks, golf courses, heritage conservation, and hotel developments) and has provided trainings to hotels, casinos and integrated resorts. Her research interests focus on sustainable tourism planning, casino gaming/integrated resort management, heritage conservation and management, hospitality services and urban planning. DR. ALINA ZHANG HONG KONG POLYTECHNIC UNIVERSITY

Dr. Alina Zhang is a Lecturer of the Division of Business and Hospitality Management in the College of Professional and Continuing Education (CPCE) at The Hong Kong PolyU. Dr Zhang received her Bachelor of Engineering and Master of Science from The Huazhong University of Science and Technology, China, and PhD from The University of Hong Kong. She worked as a Postdoctoral Fellow at the School of Hotel and Tourism Management of PolyU before joining CPCE. Dr Zhang's research interests include tourism demand forecasting, tourism supply chain management, and information and communication technology. Her research have been published in various peer-reviewed international journals such as Tourism Management, International Journal of Tourism Research, Tourism Economics, Service Industries Journal, and other internationally renowned journals.



PROF. YING ZHAO SUN YAT-SEN UNIVERSITY

Professor Zhao is Associate professor in the School of Tourism Management. She is the vice director of Department of Tourism Management and Planning. She is also the technical director in Xishangbanna monitoring of tourism sustainable development in UNWTO.
